The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

The doctrine of the taking up of the body and soul of the Mother of God into heaven after her death, was an early teaching of the Church Fathers and of special interest to all Christians. Tradition and theological reasoning show that the privilege of the Assumption was revealed implicitly. On November 1, 1950, Pope Pius XII declared the Assumption of the Blessed Mother of God a doctrine of the Catholic faith. The solemnity is celebrated on August 15 and is a holy day of obligation. All Catholics are to be in attendance at Mass.

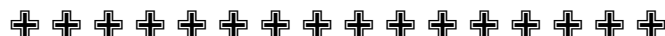
